OVERCOMING OBSTACLES DURING COVID-19

The Cody Rouge Community Action Alliance Community Development and Outreach Program (CRCAA/CDOP) was able to be productive despite the challenges presented by the Covid-19 pandemic. CRCAA/COP has continued to serve the residents and stakeholders by utilizing innovative practices and adaptive strategies.

During 2020-2022, we created positive change in four specific program areas:

Neighborhood Stabilization Youth Development

Community Engagement

Senior University



Neighborhood Partners Sign Project

Cody Rouge Neighborhoods enjoy the benefits of a cooperative relationship among the 7 neighborhood associations and block clubs. The leadership of each organization developed a plan to design and install geographical neighborhood signs for each organization.

COVID-19 Awareness Campaign (Partner: Trinity Health)

A team of six (6) residents were recruited and trained to serve as canvassers and advocates. Residents in the City of Detroit District 7 were spoken to concerning COVID Awareness and Safety, Vaccination Information, and Food Distribution.

HOPE Program

The HOPE program is a partnership between the Rocket Community Fund, City of Detroit Assessment Division, and the Wayne County Treasurer Office. The program addresses inequities in property tax assessments and relieves burdensome tax arrearage. The results will support neighborhood enhancement through housing stabilization.

Warrendale Exterior Home Repair Program (Partner: Michigan State Housing Development Authority)

The 2021 MSHDA Exterior Home Repair Program successfully repaired the exterior of six (6) homes in the Warrendale Neighborhood. The increased value of the homes ranged from \$5,000 to \$10,000 increased market value. The repairs also impacted the homeowner's ability to insure their homes.



Youth Council

The Cody Rouge Youth Council met for weekly meetings virtually throughout 2021. In meetings, participants explored social emotional learning topics such as defining community and self-awareness. They also explored college preparation and career readiness assignments and activities.

Teen Art Space

The Teen Art Space launched in 2021, meeting with art therapists from Let's Art About and exploring various topics while producing art projects.

GDYT

CRCAA functioned as a lead agency in the Grow Detroit's Young Talent, managing the employment experience of Cody Rouge Youth. Youth explored career readiness and financial literacy topics and assignments over a six-week period between July and August 2021.

High H.O.P.E.S. (Helping Others Prepare for Success)

A skills development and job readiness training program focused on reducing the likelihood of criminal behaviors in youth. Youth were virtual offerings through CRCAA, including those of the Youth Council, Family Nights, and the Grow Detroit's Young Talent summer program, and to become involved in neighborhood service activities

Detroit's 0% Interest Home Repair Loan Program

Detroit's 0% Interest Home Repair Loan is a no-interest loan offered to Detroit homeowners who have owned their home for at least 6 months. Cody Rouge Community Action Alliance services potential borrowers from all over the city, especially the Cody Rouge area.

Know Your Numbers Health Fairs

Three monthly health fairs were hosted in March, April, ad May of 2022. Participants were given various health screenings and given the opportunity to consult with medical professionals. COVID vaccinations were offered as well as STI testing.

Senior Connect

Bi-weekly gathering of senior citizens to combat aloneness through fellowship and shared resources led by AmeriCorps members and CRCAA canvass team.





Cody Rouge Community Action Alliance partnered with Franklin Park Community Association, Joy Community Associations, Southfield Plymouth Community Association, Warrendale Community Organization, and Friends of Rouge Park to launch Senior University. The purpose of Senior University is to restore independence in our senior citizens through fundamental basics in computer education and support senior needs.

Nearly 30 small classes of 10 participants were held for 90 minutes, allowing the seniors the opportunity to learn in an intimate setting. Seniors had the opportunity to participant in various events like Painting with a Twist, Senior Day of Celebrations, Senior Ice Cream Social, Community Garden Beautification, Yoga in the Park, DIA Inside/Out, and a Senior Citizen Prom.


